

National Music Centre receives \$1 million from RBC Foundation and launches RBC Presents NMC Summer Sessions

(Calgary, AB — June 19, 2015) The National Music Centre (NMC) has received an investment of \$1 million from RBC Foundation towards the new NMC facility, recently named Studio Bell, which is slated to open in spring 2016.

The gift will be used towards creating the RBC Master in Residence Mentorship Program, and naming a part of the new facility, the RBC Terrace Commons, which will be a gathering space for Artists in Residence to collaborate and create with other artists, producers and technicians, as well as a popular event-hosting area.

The RBC Master in Residence Mentorship Program invites emerging artists to work under the leadership of a Master in Residence chosen to inspire creativity, encourage innovation, share expertise, and provide mentorship.

"RBC has been a proud supporter of the National Music Centre for several years and we are excited to grow our investment and help to foster future talent," said Jeff Boyd, Regional President, RBC Alberta and the Territories. "We are committed to supporting emerging talent and believe the new Master in Residence Mentorship Program at NMC will have a tremendous impact on artists' ability to grow in their careers."

This funding will also support NMC in delivering RBC presents NMC Summer Sessions, a new jazz summer program to support artist development and community engagement.

"We are proud of our history working with RBC to develop Canada's future music icons in jazz," said Andrew Mosker, President and CEO of NMC. "NMC will offer a unique, artist-focused residency program that pairs our collection of rare instruments with music technology. RBC's gift will further enable NMC to become an international hub for musicians to explore and grow when we open in 2016."

RBC presents NMC Summer Sessions runs from June 16-20. Along with JazzYYC, and the Calgary Association for the Development of Music Education (CADME), the five-day event brings together musicians, educators and fans for a series of concerts and workshops at NMC that showcase some of Calgary and Canada's greatest jazz artists.
