This sponsorship will support the *Stories and Song Initiative*, which will create three different programs dedicated to telling the unique stories of Albertans from different generations and backgrounds.

The ATB Financial Alberta Oral History Recording Project will collect and preserve interviews with unique and powerful voices that explore Alberta's music history from the perspectives of musicians, fans, industry pioneers, and art champions.

The ATB Financial Alberta Stories Roadcase will bring digital storytelling into the classroom as grade 4-6 students collect, record, and share stories of our musical heritage with other students across Alberta.

The content from these programs will be shared online and through the annual *We Are Alberta* exhibition slated to open in the new NMC building. The new NMC will open its doors in 2016, and *We Are Alberta* will be an important special exhibition that features stories that are both crowd-sourced and curated.
