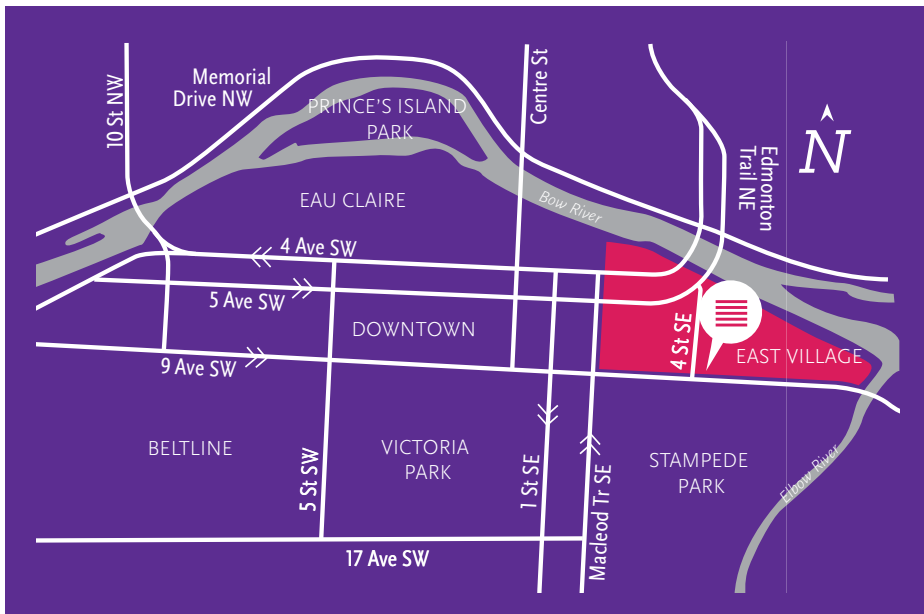

Ten years ago, Canada did not have a national home for music. Today, Studio Bell, home of the National Music Centre in Calgary, Alberta, stands as Canada's national home for musical heritage, a place where our country's music lives, breathes, evolves, and unites us as a country. While rooted in Western Canada, NMC exists for all Canadians, reflecting the full breadth of our country's voices, stories, and sounds, and serving as a connector from coast to coast to coast.

What began as an ambitious idea has grown into something far greater. Together with artists, supporters, partners, and community, we have built a unique national movement that uses history to make history. Over the past decade, we have welcomed more than one million visitors, stewarded and developed one of the most significant collections of musical heritage in the world, and supported and amplified the stories of Canadian artists and creators across cultures and genres. We have also played a meaningful role in the transformation of Calgary's East Village, helping position Alberta as an emerging leader in Canada's music story.

This milestone is not only about what has been built, but how it has been built collectively.

As we enter our 10th anniversary year, we are building on that momentum with an ambitious slate of programming, including welcoming the global Music Cities Convention to Calgary and advancing plans for a major exhibition featuring Canadian music icon Joni Mitchell in 2027.

Music has a unique ability to connect us across regions, languages, and cultures. As Canada's national home for musical heritage, NMC is committed to strengthening those connections through national partnerships and community programming, and ensuring that our musical heritage remains accessible, relevant, and alive for future generations.

As we mark this 10th anniversary, we are not simply looking back; we are setting the stage for what comes next. The pages that follow highlight 10 Signature Stories. Each reflects a defining idea, partnership, or impact from NMC's first decade. Together, they demonstrate how a bold vision became Canada's national home for musical heritage, and how that work continues to shape the future of music in Canada.

This anniversary belongs to all of you, artists in every genre, donors, governments, sponsors, partners, and all the cultural communities in Canada who made it possible. And the next chapter is just beginning.

MESSAGE DU PRÉSIDENT-DIRECTEUR GÉNÉRAL

Il y a dix ans, le Canada ne disposait pas d'un lieu national consacré à la musique. Aujourd'hui, Studio Bell, demeure du Centre national de musique à Calgary, en Alberta, s'impose comme le lieu national dédié au patrimoine musical du Canada, un endroit où la musique de notre pays vit, respire évolue et nous unit comme pays. Bien ancré dans l'Ouest canadien, le CNM existe pour tous les Canadiens, reflétant toute la richesse de nos voix, de nos histoires et de nos sonorités, et agissant comme un lien d'un océan à l'autre à l'autre.

Ce qui n'était au départ qu'une idée ambitieuse est devenu quelque chose de bien plus grand. Avec les artistes, les donateurs, les partenaires et la communauté, nous avons bâti un mouvement national unique qui s'appuie sur l'histoire pour en écrire une nouvelle. Au cours de la dernière décennie, nous avons accueilli plus d'un million de visiteurs, préservé et développé l'une des plus importantes collections de patrimoine musical au monde, et amplifié et mis en valeur les histoires d'artistes et de créateurs canadiens issus de toutes les cultures et de tous les genres musicaux. Nous avons également contribué de façon significative à la transformation du quartier East Village à Calgary, en aidant à positionner l'Alberta comme un acteur émergent dans l'histoire musicale du Canada.

Cette étape importante ne concerne pas seulement ce qui a été accompli, mais aussi la manière dont cela a été réalisé, collectivement.

Alors que nous entamons notre 10^e année anniversaire, nous poursuivons sur cette lancée avec une programmation ambitieuse, notamment en accueillant à Calgary la conférence internationale Music Cities et en faisant progresser les préparatifs d'une grande exposition consacrée à l'icône canadienne de la musique Joni Mitchell en 2027.

La musique a cette capacité unique de nous rassembler, au-delà des régions, des langues et des cultures. En tant que lieu national du patrimoine musical, le CNM s'engage à renforcer ces liens grâce à des partenariats pancanadiens, à une programmation ancrée dans la communauté, et à faire en sorte que notre patrimoine musical demeure accessible, pertinent et vivant pour les générations à venir.

En soulignant ce 10^e anniversaire, nous ne faisons pas que regarder en arrière; nous préparons l'avenir. Les pages qui suivent présentent 10 histoires marquantes. Chacune met en lumière une idée, un partenariat ou un impact déterminant de la première décennie du CNM. Ensemble, elles illustrent comment une vision audacieuse est devenue le lieu national du patrimoine musical du Canada, et comment ce travail continue de façonner l'avenir de la musique au pays.

Cet anniversaire vous appartient à toutes et à tous — artistes de tous les genres, donateurs, gouvernements, commanditaires, partenaires et communautés culturelles de partout au Canada — qui avez contribué à le rendre possible. Et la suite ne fait que commencer.

LETTER FROM THE SENIOR DIRECTOR OF COLLECTIONS AND EXHIBITIONS

At the National Music Centre, we care for—and care about—the artifacts that tell Canada’s musical story.

These include handwritten lyrics, instruments, stage outfits, and personal materials that document the work of artists across the country. They are not just objects. They are part of our cultural record, and they shape how that record is understood, preserved, and shared.

Increasingly, these collections are at risk of being sold, divided, or leaving the country altogether. When that happens, they often move out of public reach and away from the context that gives them meaning. Over time, the story becomes harder to access, less complete, and more difficult to pass on.

Ensuring these stories remain intact and accessible is a critical part of our work. It allows artists, researchers, and the public to engage directly with the materials that have shaped Canadian music, and to see themselves reflected in that history.

At Studio Bell, home of the National Music Centre, these collections are preserved and brought forward through exhibitions that connect audiences to the artists, ideas, and moments that define them. They are not only protected here, they are experienced—through sound, through storytelling, and through direct interaction with the music itself.

As we mark our 10th anniversary, that work continues through a new group of exhibitions. This year includes a feature exhibition on Nelly Furtado, alongside new experiences such as *Listen: The Pursuit of Perfect Sound* and *PlayLab*, a free drop-in creative hub for families. Looking ahead, we are also preparing a major Joni Mitchell retrospective tied to her relationship with jazz, opening in 2027. We continue to evolve our Hall of Fame exhibitions and core galleries, ensuring the story we tell remains current, representative, and engaging.

Taken together, these exhibitions reflect the depth of Canada’s musical legacy and the ways it continues to evolve.

We look forward to welcoming you and sharing these experiences with you throughout this anniversary year.

MESSAGE DU DIRECTEUR PRINCIPAL DES COLLECTIONS ET DES EXPOSITIONS

Au Centre national de musique, nous prenons soin — et nous nous soucions — des artefacts qui racontent l’histoire musicale du Canada.

Il s’agit notamment de paroles manuscrites, d’instruments, de costumes de scène et de documents personnels qui témoignent du travail d’artistes de partout au pays. Ce ne sont pas de simples objets. Ils font partie de notre mémoire culturelle et façonnent la manière dont cette histoire est comprise, préservée et transmise.

De plus en plus, ces collections risquent d’être vendues, fragmentées ou de quitter le pays. Lorsqu’elles sont dispersées, elles échappent souvent à l’accès du public et sont séparées du contexte qui leur donne tout leur sens. Avec le temps, l’histoire devient plus difficile d’accès, moins complète et plus difficile à transmettre.

Veiller à ce que ces histoires demeurent intactes et accessibles est une part essentielle de notre travail. Cela permet aux artistes, aux chercheurs et au public d’entrer en contact direct avec les éléments qui ont façonné la musique canadienne, et de s’y reconnaître.

À Studio Bell, domicile du Centre national de musique, ces collections sont préservées et mises en valeur à travers des expositions qui relient le public aux artistes, aux idées et aux moments qui les définissent. Elles ne sont pas seulement protégées : elles sont vécues — par le son, par le récit et par une interaction directe avec la musique elle-même.

Alors que nous soulignons notre 10^e anniversaire, ce travail se poursuit à travers une nouvelle série d’expositions. Cette année comprend une exposition phare consacrée à Nelly Furtado, ainsi que de nouvelles expériences comme *Listen: The Pursuit of Perfect Sound* et *PlayLab*, un espace créatif libre d’accès pour les familles. À plus long terme, nous préparons également une grande rétrospective consacrée à Joni Mitchell et à sa relation avec le jazz, qui ouvrira en 2027. Nous continuons aussi de faire évoluer nos expositions du Panthéon de la musique et nos galeries permanentes afin que l’histoire que nous racontons demeure actuelle, représentative et engageante.

Ensemble, ces expositions témoignent de la richesse de l’héritage musical du Canada et de son évolution continue.

Nous avons hâte de vous accueillir et de partager ces expériences avec vous tout au long de cette année anniversaire.

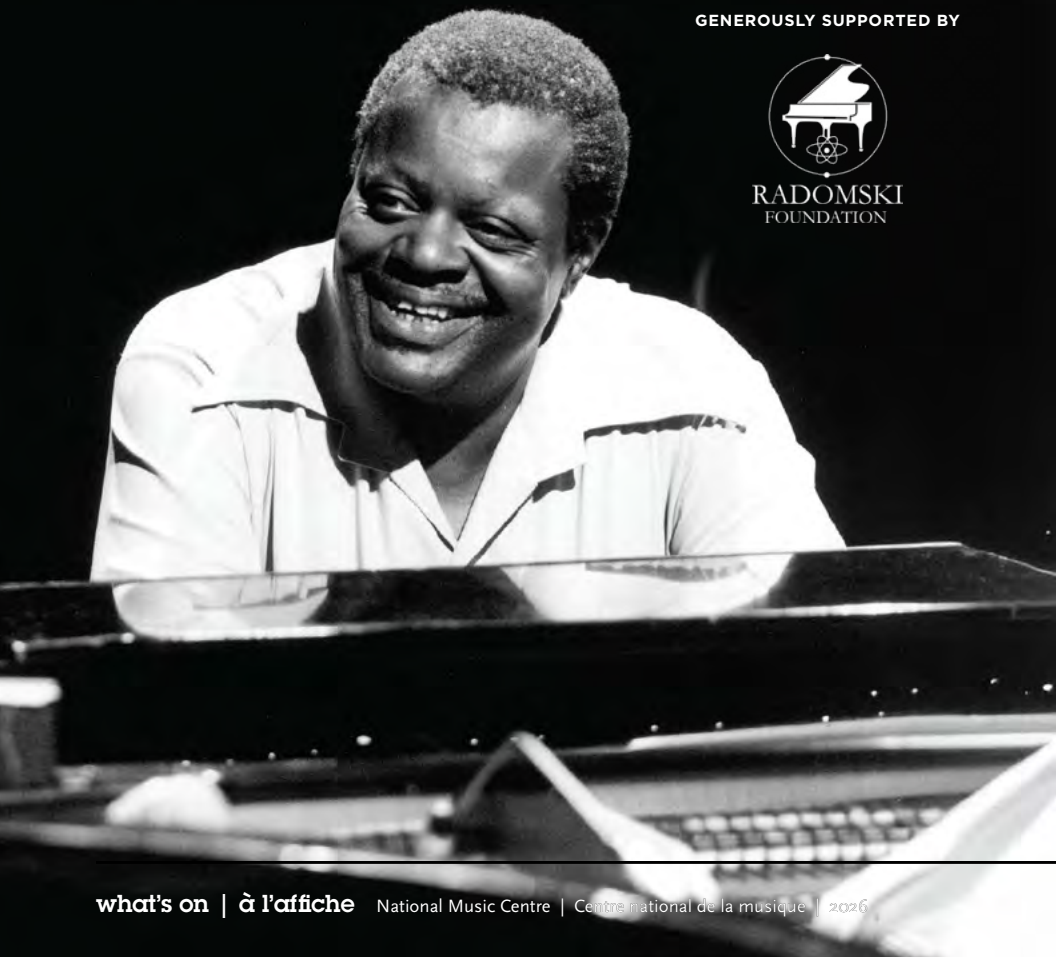

The exhibition celebrates the extraordinary life, music, and legacy of the virtuosic jazz pianist, composer, and humanitarian who captivated audiences around the world. The exhibition features musical instruments from Oscar Peterson's home studio, including vintage synthesizers, electronic instruments, and recording gear that illustrate his pioneering use and early adoption of electronic music technology.

 The headstock, which can be flush with the neck or sit at an angle, contains tuning pegs that adjust the tension—and, by extension, the pitch—of the strings.

4 SOUNDBOARD
 The guitar's flat wooden face, the soundboard helps amplify the string vibrations to create music with help from the sound hole, the opening in the surface that facilitates the projection of sound.

5 BRIDGE
 The bridge transmits the vibration of the strings to the body of the instrument so the sound can be amplified. It also acts as a counterpart to the head, holding the strings in place.

LIONA BOYD
 With her 1986 album, *A Guitar for Christmas*, Boyd became the first classical guitarist to go platinum in Canada. Known affectionately as the First Lady of the Guitar, she has recorded with Yo-Yo Ma and Eric Clapton and is a member of the Order of Canada, among dozens of others honours.

Is my Studio Bell admission ticket for timed entry?

Studio Bell admission is not timed entry, so your admission ticket is valid all day. You are welcome to come and go during the day, just ensure to show your ticket to the Visitor Experience desk upon re-entry.

How much time do people typically spend at Studio Bell?

To explore all five floors of the museum, we recommend spending two hours. If you choose to visit Studio Bell on a day when other programming is happening, this may increase the length of your visit.

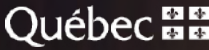

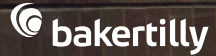
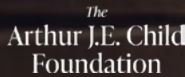
