A Cultural Landmark for Canada

This 160,000-square-foot facility, designed by Brad Cloepfil of Allied Works Architecture, is the first national cultural institution dedicated to celebrating music in Canada in all of its forms. Studio Bell rises in nine interlocking towers, clad in glazed terra cotta in the heart of Calgary's East Village.


Cloepfil found inspiration in musical instruments and the landscape of Western Canada. Can you spot these influences as you tour the building?




Welcome to Canada Music Square, the heart of Studio Bell. Buy tickets, start a guided tour, take a break, or grab a souvenir.





NMC's Top Five

Dive into NMC's collection, and don't miss the following:

The King Eddy (Across 4 Street)

Built in 1905, the historic King Eddy was the first desegregated bar in Calgary and a celebrated blues destination in the '80s. It's now open as a restaurant, bar, and live music venue.



Garnet Herzog Overdrive Unit (Level 2, Made In Canada) Developed by Thomas "Gar" Gillies—founder of the Garnet Amplifier Company—the Herzog was built in collaboration with The Guess Who and Bachman-Turner Overdrive guitarist, Randy Bachman. The resulting Garnet Herzog went on to become the signature "Winnipeg sound" heard on tracks such as "American Woman" and "No Time."



Kimball Theatre Organ (Level 3, Sound Affects) This 64-foot-long theatre organ was used during the silent movie era of the '20s and '30s. Check with the front desk fo

Halls of Fame (Level 4)

Explore the newly-updated Canadian Songwriters Hall of Fame, ADISQ Hall of Fame, and Canadian Country Music Hall of Fame celebrating some of the greatest legends in Canada's music story.

Featuring musical artifacts, one-of-a-kind memorabilia, and tributes to the latest inductees, this exhibition pays homage to Canada's most renowned music icons.
