Uzbek-born piano virtuoso **Roman Rabinovich**'s playing has been described as compelling, dynamic, and highly sensitive. Since winning the 2008 Rubinstein International Piano Competition, he has performed throughout the United States and Europe to great critical acclaim, including praise from The New York Times, BBC Music Magazine, and others.

Dmitry Nesterov arrived on the Canadian music scene from Russia in 1992 when he became a Laureate in the first Esther Honens Calgary International Piano Competition. Since settling in Canada with his family in 1994, Nesterov has appeared as a soloist with the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra, the Edmonton Symphony, the Lethbridge and Red Deer Symphonies as well as with numerous orchestras in Russia.

Donovan Seidle is a versatile musician—equally comfortable performing in the concertmaster chair or in the soloist spotlight as he is on the conductor's podium of a scoring stage. As Assistant Concertmaster of the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra, and Artistic Director/Concertmaster of the Kensington Sinfonia, Donovan maintains a busy orchestral performance schedule.

JUNO-nominated **Land's End Ensemble** (John Lowry, violin; Beth Root Sandvoss, cello; Susanne Ruberg-Gordon, piano; Vincent Ho, Artistic Director) is dedicated to introducing audiences to new music by Canadian and international composers, and to performing landmark chamber works of the 20th and 21st centuries.

Kensington Sinfonia is a string chamber ensemble that has been presenting classical and crossover concerts in Calgary for over 30 years.

The only organization of its kind in Western Canada, **Prairie Debut** links the best Canadian classical and world music artists to over 80 communities. Most are rural and outside of the larger centres in Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, and the Yukon.

Karl Hirzer and **Josué Valdepeñas** are both members of the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra (CPO). Hirzer is a pianist and the Associate Conductor at CPO. Josué Valdepeñas performs in the CPO's cello section.

New Works Calgary, through its concert series, supports the creation and performance of contemporary concert music—a confluence of creative energies from composers, musicians, and adventurous listeners.

Stingray Classical Live from the King Eddy runs from October 11 until November 29. Admission is free and all shows will also be streamed on NMC's Facebook page.
